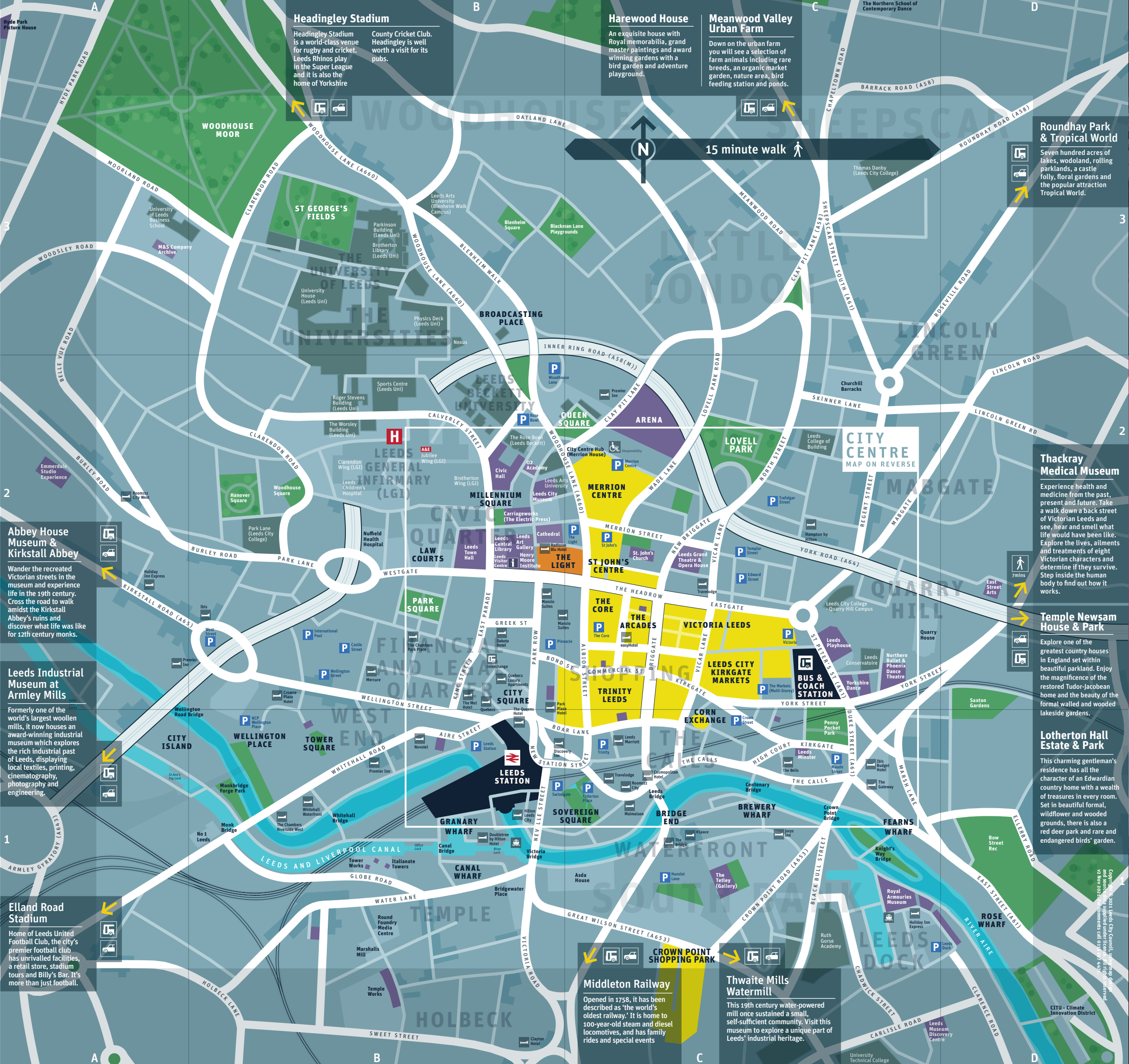

Headingley Stadium
Headingley Stadium is a world-class venue for rugby and cricket. Leeds Rhinos play in the Super League and it is also the home of Yorkshire County Cricket Club. Headingley is well worth a visit for its pubs.

Harewood House
An exquisite house with Royal memorabilia, grand master paintings and award winning gardens with a bird garden and adventure playground.

Meanwood Valley Urban Farm
Down on the urban farm you will see a selection of farm animals including rare breeds, an organic market garden, nature area, bird feeding station and ponds.

Roundhay Park & Tropical World
Seven hundred acres of lakes, woodland, rolling parklands, a castle folly, floral gardens and the popular attraction Tropical World.

Thackray Medical Museum
Experience health and medicine from the past, present and future. Take a walk down a back street of Victorian Leeds and see, hear and smell what life would have been like. Explore the lives, ailments and treatments of eight Victorian characters and determine if they survive. Step inside the human body to find out how it works.

Temple Newsam House & Park
Explore one of the greatest country houses in England set within beautiful parkland. Enjoy the magnificence of the restored Tudor-Jacobean home and the beauty of the formal walled and wooded lakeside gardens.

Lotherton Hall Estate & Park
This charming gentleman's residence has all the character of an Edwardian country home with a wealth of treasures in every room. Set in beautiful formal, wildflower and wooded grounds, there is also a red deer park and rare and endangered birds' garden.

Abbey House Museum & Kirkstall Abbey
Wander the recreated Victorian streets in the museum and experience life in the 19th century. Cross the road to walk amidst the Kirkstall Abbey's ruins and discover what life was like for 12th century monks.

Leeds Industrial Museum at Armlay Mills
Formerly one of the world's largest woollen mills, it now houses an award-winning industrial museum which explores the rich industrial past of Leeds, displaying local textiles, printing, cinematography, photography and engineering.

Elland Road Stadium
Home of Leeds United Football Club, the city's premier football club has unrivalled facilities, a retail store, stadium tours and Billy's Bar. It's more than just football.

Middleton Railway
Opened in 1758, it has been described as 'the world's oldest railway.' It is home to 100-year-old steam and diesel locomotives, and has family rides and special events

Thwaite Mills Watermill
This 19th century water-powered mill once sustained a small, self-sufficient community. Visit this museum to explore a unique part of Leeds' industrial heritage.
